Title: knowledge and understanding of Japanese Encephalitis among health professionals in a tertiary care hospital of Pune: A Cross sectional study

Introduction:

Japanese encephalitis (JE) is a mosquito borne encephalitis caused by Group B arbovirus (Flavivirus). It is a zoonotic disease i.e. infecting mainly animals and accidentally man. The vast majority of cases occur among children less than 15 years of age. Nearly 10% cases among those above 60 years perhaps reflecting waning protective immunity.¹

The high fatality rate and frequent residual neuropsychiatric sequel in survivors make JE a considerable health problem.²

According to World Health Organization (WHO) report, approximately 3 billion people are living in countries, which are at risk of JE in Southeast Asia and Western Pacific.³

In India, JE is considered as a serious pediatric problem as its epidemic has been reported from many parts of the country since 1952.. In India, JE virus activity was, however, first detected in 1952 through sero-epidemiological surveys in Nagpur district of Maharashtra and Chingleput district of Tamil Nadu.⁴

Till 2001, there was no problem of JE in Maharashtra State. But during 2002 & 2003 J. E. infection was introduced in eastern districts such as Bhandara, Gondiya, & Nagpur. During 2004 there were only 3 focal outbreaks of JE in districts Gadchiroli, Parbhani & Wardha & during 2005 there were 6 focal outbreaks of JE in Amravati, Yeotmal & Nagpur districts .⁵

The healthcare professionals are an important members of the society to combat the disease outbreaks like JE. Additionally, they are important source of information to general public to provide counselling, education and prevention. Therefore, the knowledge and understanding of JE among Health professionals needed to be standardized as it will be critical in educating and protecting communities. In view of this, and due to paucity of published data, we would like to conduct this study to assess the knowledge and understanding about JE among Health care professionals.

Objective:

1. To check the knowledge among health care professionals for JE.
2. To assess relation of knowledge with experience of practice.

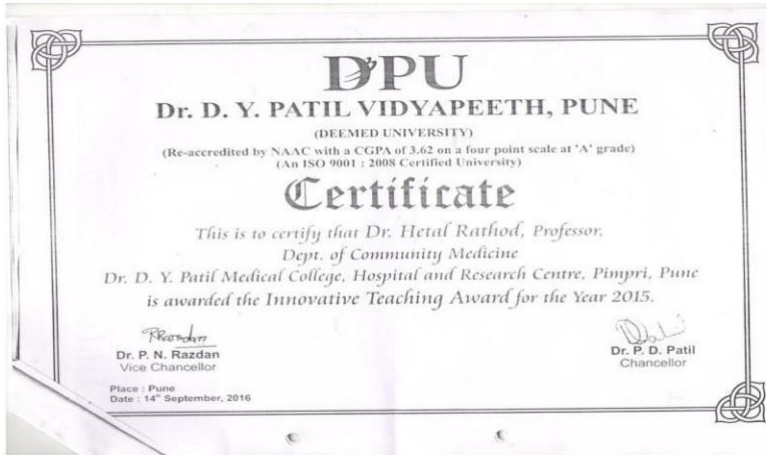

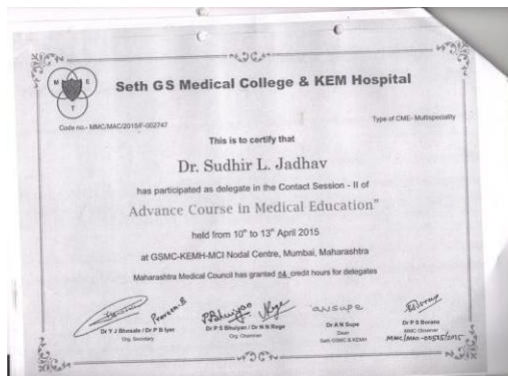
Brief biography:

After finishing that, in 2007, I started a PhD Postgraduate Program in Psychiatry at the same University and promptly finished it in 2009. Currently, since 2009, I have an academic position as a Psychiatry Professor at Federal University of Health Sciences of Porto Alegre. Since 2010 I supervise the Extension Program named "Cinepsychiatry", which is designed to discuss and to teach psychiatry through cinema.

Description and purposes:
 Movies have the power of mimic life. Based on it, movies have been used for teaching psychopathology as well as to reduce negative attitudes toward mental illness. Those two hours experience produce an important setting to reflect about our own practice and may develop an empathic feeling that can help people to learn and change.
 This series uses specific movies to describe clinical conditions, discussing them as examples of real cases, in which the characters would play the role of a patient and the movie history would represent the context in which the patient is contextualized. Each case would be followed by related real clinical cases, its key theoretical issues and concepts. Each volume will be constructed upon the selection of ten movies, each

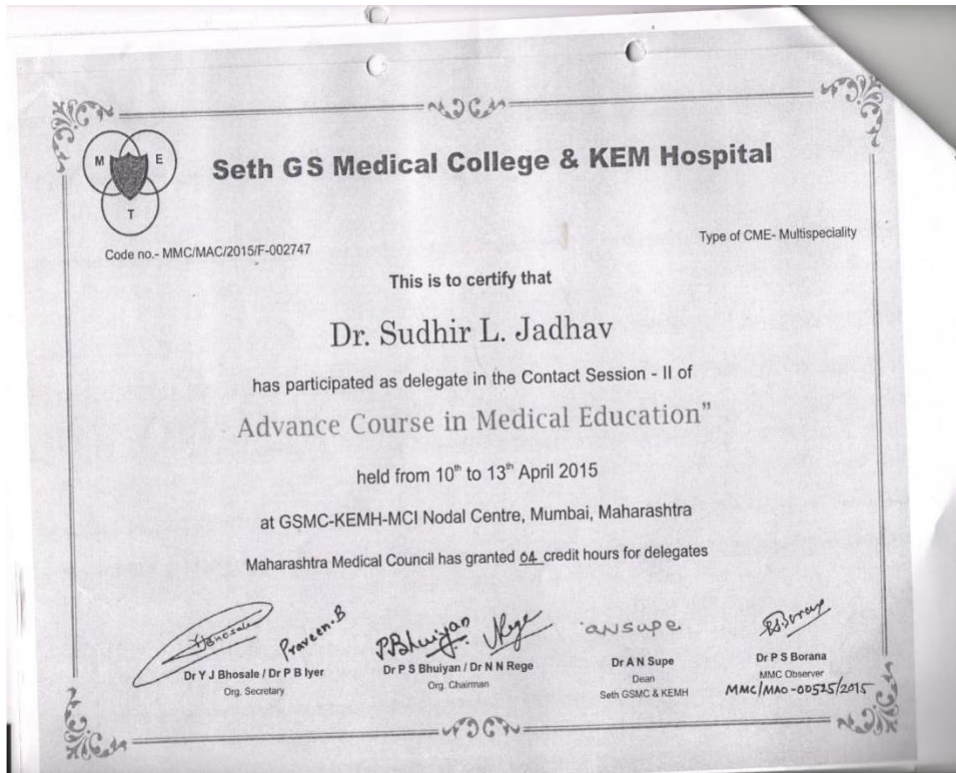
