The Department of Pharmacology is a recognized Regional Pharmacovigilance Centre under National Coordination Committee for Pharmacovigilance Programme of India since Aug 2011.

The Department of Pharmacology is one of the important Adverse Drug Reaction monitoring centre (AMC) in the region. It involves monitoring, reporting and communication of Individual Case Safety Reports (ICSRs) associated with drugs, medical devices and vaccines with strict standard operating procedures to follow. The Causality Assessment Committee (CAC) evaluates the ADR report, makes recommendations and reports the ADR to the FDA and the drug manufacturer through web-based application called Vigiflow. Also our department has initiated the distribution of ADR cards to the concerned patients experiencing the adverse reaction, so as to prevent occurrences of the same reactions if any in future. Our department has been engaged in this extension activity since 8 years and will continue to do the same in future too.
