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
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# **Background**


Arterio-Venous Fistula is mandatory for hemodialysis.

**Fistula First**" initiative is a current practice.

A Radio-Cephalic Arterio-venous Fistula is a Gold standard technique.



### Ulnar Basilic AV Fistula is a viable alternative option.



## Why Ulnar Basilic AV Fistula is a viable option?

1. Dominant artery of the hand.

2. The Basilic Vein is usually patent.

3. Low incidence of 'Vascular Steal'

4. Low incidence of hand oedema

## Difficulties of the Classical Position

#### **Classical Position**



- Prone Position
- Hyper-pronated Arm
- Extended Elbow

- 1. Uncomfortable position
- 2. Difficulty in monitoring and intervening on patient

# How to overcome this difficulty of position?

- The patients were operated after being placed in our modified position
- We have named this position "The Royal Wave"

#### Our Modified Position



- 1. Supine position
- 2. The arm is abducted to right angle
- 3. The arm is externally rotated at the shoulder
- 4. The elbow is flexed to  $90^{\circ}$
- 5. The forearm kept in about midprone position






'The Royal Wave' Position used by the British Royal Family whilst greeting crowds

## Result

- We have created 6 Ulnar basilic AV Fistulas.
- Ease of surgery
- Comfort to the patient.
- They remained patent (confirmed by doppler).
- Sufficient arterialization of the Basilic Vein.
- It preserves the proximal fistulas as back-up option.
