

#### History of presenting illness

- Fever : high-grade acute onset , continuous, with chills
- Body ache : Progressive worsened by movement
- Muscle pain : acute in onset , progressive . More in thigh muscles associated with tenderness

#### **NEGATIVE HISTORY**

Nausea vomiting

Abdominal pain



discolouration of skin

Trauma Strenuous exercise

Altered mental status focal sensory defecit

#### PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

- lacktriangle A young male who is obese and  $\,$  oriented to time, place and person .
- □ No pallor ,icterus , cyanosis , clubbing, edema , lymphadenopathy
- RS: bilateral vesicular breath sounds heard, no added breath sounds
- ☐ CVS:s1s2 heard
- Abdominal examination : soft non tender , bowel sounds heard ,normal digital rectal examination.

### **Differential diagnosis**

- Viral infection (dengue, Chikungunya, Influenza, COVID – 19)
- Compartment syndrome
- Rhabdomyolysis
- Acute viral myositis
- sepsis



Patient was started on fluids and analagesics
