Conversation with a Topper: Insights from Dr. Bhavika Rathi, a High-Achieving MBBS Student

Being an MBBS student who is at the top of her class, how did you manage your work-life balance throughout the course?

It all came down to smart time management and self-discipline. I planned my week in advance, set clear priorities, and made sure to include time for rest, hobbies, and a social life. Staying consistent, getting enough sleep, and taking short breaks helped me avoid burnout.



How would you describe your college life?

My college life has been an incredible journey- it's been challenging but truly rewarding! I have made amazing friends, met some fantastic faculty, and yes, I have faced some tough moments, but that's all part of the experience. I balanced studying with fun, and looking back, I wouldn't change a thing.

Do you have a piece of advice for your juniors?

My main advice would be: stay consistent, not just motivated. Build a study routine that works for you and stick to it. Don't be afraid to ask questions and never compare your journey to someone else's—everyone learns differently. Also, take care of your mental and physical health; it's just as important as academics. And finally, remember why you chose medicine—that purpose will keep you going through the toughest days.

How was your experience being a CR?

Being a class representative allowed me to be the bridge between faculty and students, helping improve communication. It also helped me get to know my batchmates better. Though challenging at times, it made me more organized and confident.

What motivational advice would you give to someone dealing with bad grades?

Bad grades don't define your ability or your future— they are just a sign that something in your approach needs adjusting, and not that you are incapable. Everyone struggles at some point, but resilience, not perfection, is what leads to success in the long run. Keep going! You are capable of more than you think.
